Boy:

'There are more than 368,000 children and young people under the age of 18 years living in South Australia.'

Girl:

'That's 21% of our total population.'

Children and young people come from diverse background and cultures with many different circumstances.'

Boy:

'4.8% are Aboriginal, 22.5% live regionally or rurally, 1.03% are in out-of-home care, 16.7% live with disability.' *(including text on screen)*

Girl:

'It's important for us to work together to enable children and young people to grow strong and to be happy, healthy and safe with opportunities for the future.'

Boy:

'South Australia's Outcomes Framework for Children and Young People can help us do that.' *(including text on screen)*

Girl:

'The framework is there to guide organisations and to make things better for children and young people.'

Boy:

'By reporting data and facts we can all see where efforts are needed most to improve outcomes.'

Girl:

'The framework was developed with lots of feedback from people in South Australia and approved by our Parliament in November 2019...'

Boy:

'...and that means all state and local government agencies should work within the framework. The framework sits in South Australia's Children and Young People (Oversight and Advocacy Bodies) Act 2016.'

Girl:

'It's a useful tool and can help everyone work together and more effectively.'

Boy:

'At the heart of the framework is a Charter of 20 statements about what all children and young people in South Australia can and should have in terms of their health, safety, wellbeing, education and citizenship.'

Girl:

'These five areas are called dimensions. Each dimension has a list of goals, called indicators. These can help organisations make informed decisions regarding the needs of children and young people. We track progress for each indicator using high quality data.'

Boy:

'Every year the Child Development Council reports how our youngest citizens are faring overall. For example, in 2020, more Aboriginal 5-year-olds were fully immunised...'

Girl:

'...an increase in children and young people in out-of-home care...'

Boy:

'...99% of children and young people were living in suitable housing...'

Girl:

'...more low birthweight babies were being born to Aboriginal mothers.'

Boy:

'The first review of the framework is in 2022 and we need your help to give us feedback.'

Girl:

'You can influence change by telling us what's important to you and your communities. Have a look at the framework on the Child Development Council website.'
